High Holiday Ticket Policy

Tickets are issued for each individual member in your family **over the age of 12**. We do this for two reasons:

- To highlight the fact that your child is a member of the synagogue, and
- To simplify the admission process should you and your child arrive separately.

Please remember that **all children age 25 and over must have their own membership**, which is offered at a special young adult rate.

Members in good standing of congregations outside the Greater Orlando area will be given complimentary tickets, provided they present a letter from their synagogue that they are members in good standing. Children of members who live in town and have reached the age of 25 must hold their own membership. Active members of the armed forces and full time students will be admitted upon showing appropriate identification.

Keepers of the Flame participants may purchase reserved seating for their immediate family, who are either members in good standing of Temple Israel or members in good standing at a synagogue outside the Greater Orlando area, for an additional \$25 each.

High Holiday Tickets for non-members will be sold for \$160.00 each and may be applied to dues if you choose to join after the High Holidays.
